Libraries Add New Books

New books added to the shelves of the public libraries of Avery, Mitchell and Yancey Counties include the following:
FOUR SEASONS NORTH by Billie Wright. A captivating journal of the first year Billie and Sam Wright spent 100 miles north of the Arctic Circle in the Brooks Mountain range of Alaska on a slope above a mountain lake.

THE HILL OF SUMMER, by J. A. Baker. In this small volume the author, a nature lover, celebrates the progress of summer across the meadows, moors, woods, and waterways of S. England. This is written by the author of *The Peregrine* which has been favorably compared to *Ring of Bright Water*.

THIRTY FOUR EAST, by Alfred Coppel. The story line, which plunges at heart pounding speed from one startling climax to the next, is intricate but always vividly clear and defies summary description. It takes place in the most disputed, politically charged, and

militarily dangerous area in the world—the Sinai Peninsula.

CITIZEN NADAR, by Charles McCarry. Here is the first objective portrait of the man whose war with the corporate state may alter forever the balance between public and private power in this country.

DYING IN THE SUN, by Donn Pearce-author of *Cool Hand Luke*. Those golden twilight years in Florida, as seen through the cold and penetrating eye of the author. Here are the poignant descriptions of how the old spend their last days. Kaleidoscopic, anecdotal, panoramic and unalterably real.

THE LEGEND OF BABY DOE, by John Burke. The colorful life and times of the Silver Queen of the West. Baby Doe was a fabulous personality. The richest and most beautiful woman in the West during her time.

THE VOICE OF ALLAH, by Edwin Hoyt. Mohammed was only one of many respected

businessmen in the hazardous caravan trade out of Mecca until at the age of about forty, he had a vision commanding him, to preach. An exciting insight into this prophet's life.

THE HUNGRY GRASS, by Richard Power. A novel of a Parish Priest. Father Conroy's death at an annual reunion of his seminary colleagues raises some perplexing questions - why did he name as his executor a priest who hardly knew him and who found him unsympathetic; why were there hundreds of pound notes stuffed in dirty jam jars. Who was this man really?

Locust Invasion

"Brood XIV" has hatched. "Brood XIV" is the designation for this year's seventeen year locust emergence in Buncombe, Caldwell, Caswell, Haywood, Jackson, McDowell, Madison, Mitchell, Watauga, Wilkes and Yancey Counties.

"Brood numbers are used to distinguish between the cicada hatches in different locales each year. Brood XIV, for example, will not emerge again until 1991. According to Jimmy Greene, an entomologist of the N.C. Department of Agriculture, people in these counties are already aware of the presence of the insects due to the racket.

Greene says locust is a misnomer as that creature is a form of grasshopper. The seventeen year locust actual name is the periodical cicadas.

"There are two groups of periodical cicadas, seventeen year and thirteen year. Adults lay the eggs in trees and shrubs and upon hatching the newborn nymphs drop to the ground where they bury and live for either the thirteen or seventeen year period. At the prescribed time they emerge, become adults and the cycle starts again," Green explained.

He said the insects are bothersome because of the constant humming-like noise they make for about six weeks. The cicadas can also damage trees when laying eggs as they drill pockets into small limbs. Greene's advice, however, was not to worry. The cicadas are rarely more than a nuisance and vanish in a short period as mysteriously as they appear.
