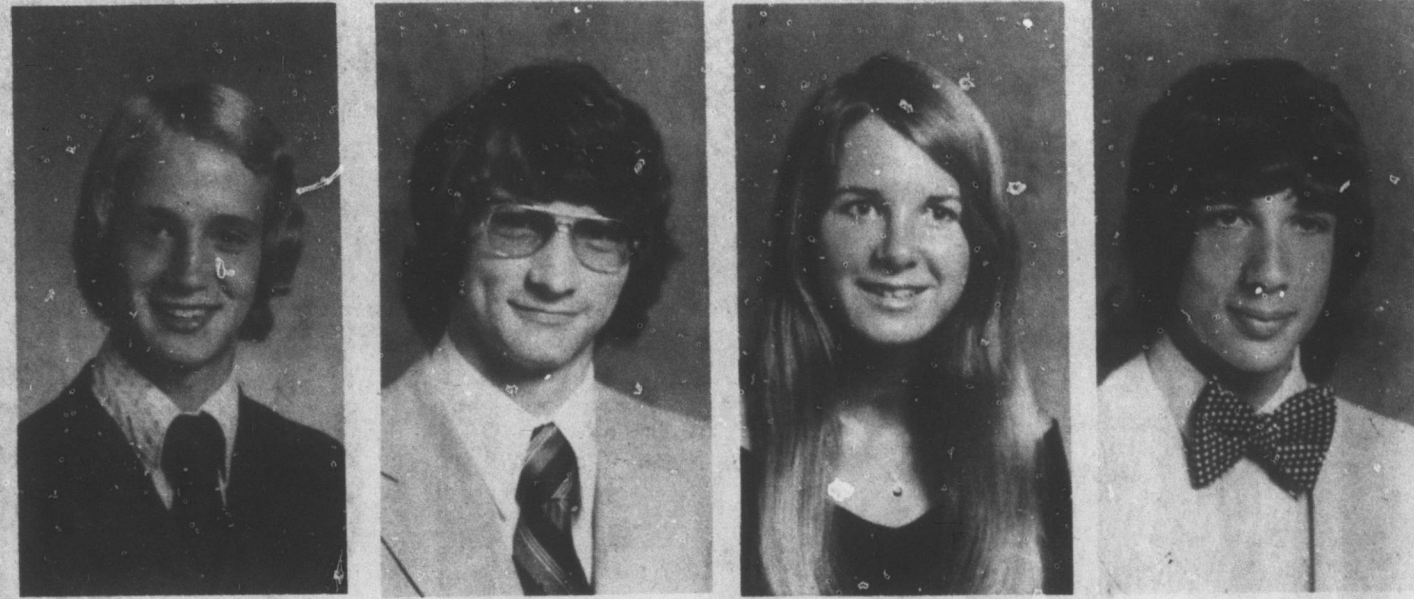

Trainees who complete the three-and-a-half hour class will be able to assist in all

phases of bloodmobile visits, including registration, recording, typing, preparing containers, carrying the units of donated blood in their plastic containers and place them in charge of the regular bloodmobile personnel from the Asheville Red Cross Blood Center; also to assist donors and see that they receive refreshments after making

their priceless gifts of blood.

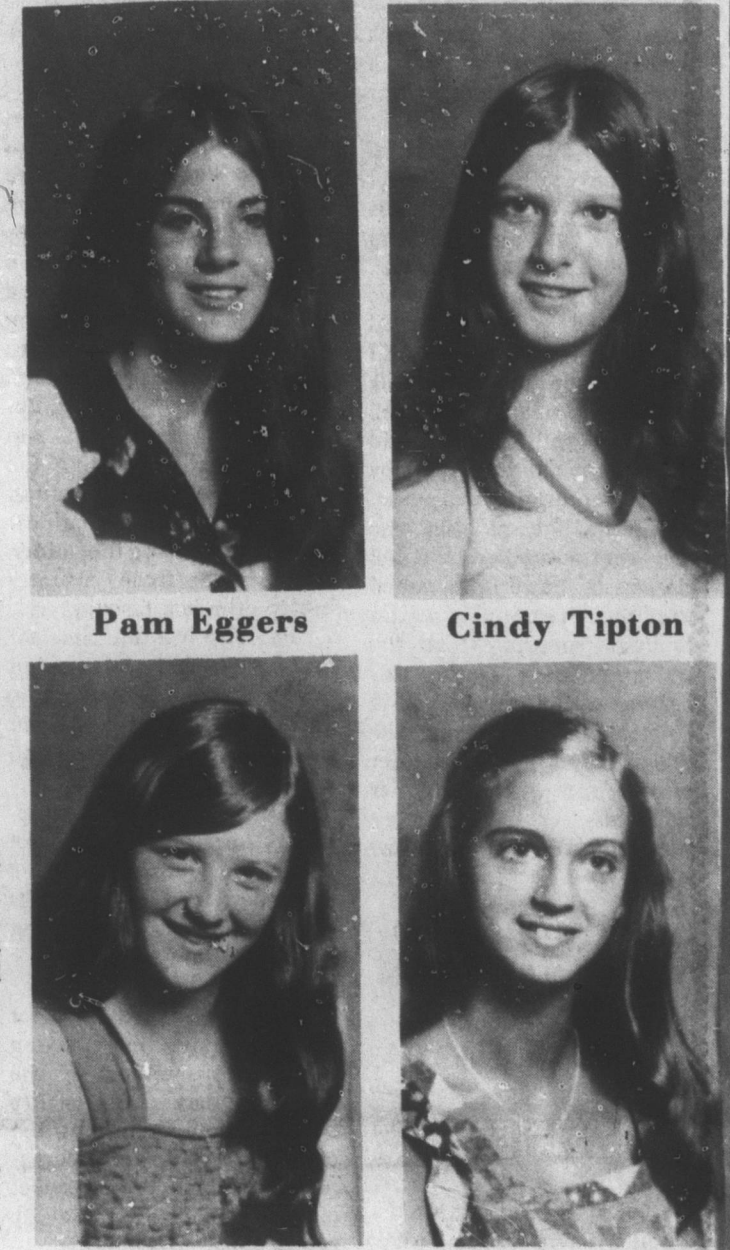
