Bakersville spent a night or so with her sister here, Mrs. Pansy Young, while she was off duty at Spruce Pine Hospital.

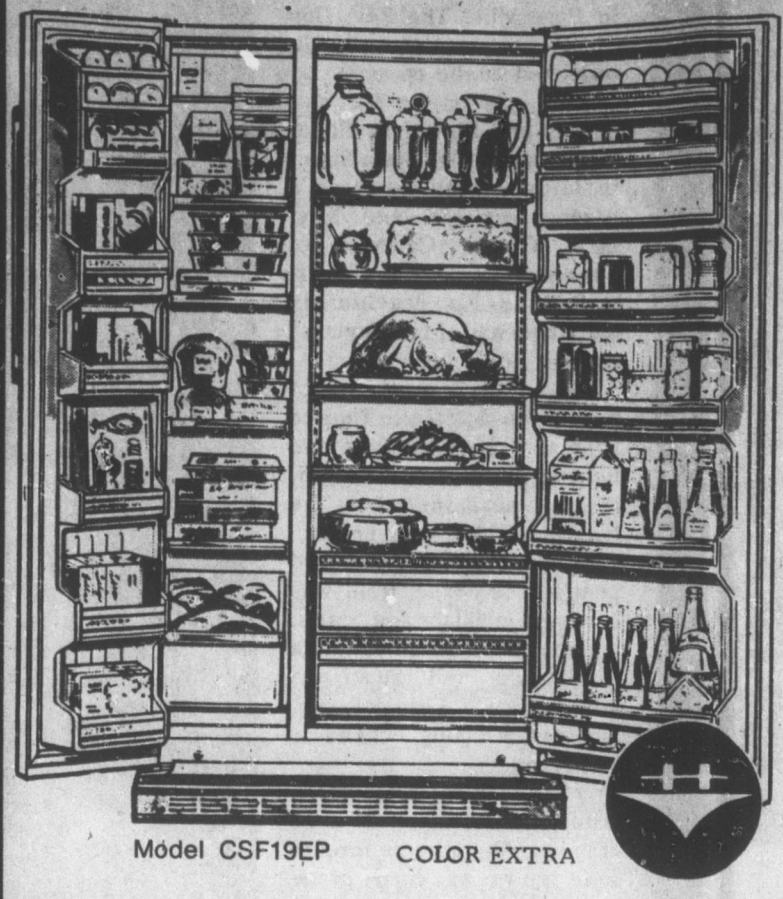
Mr. and Mrs. Curtis Hastings came through these parts yesterday from Illinois on their way to Miami, Florida where they will stay for the winter.
