## Applications Needed

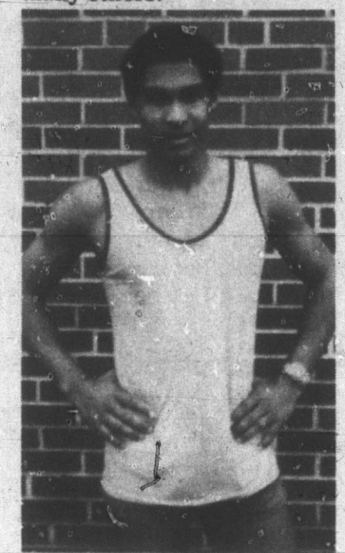

Hughes, Ricky Woody, and Ronnie Wyatt. Easy Yancey Mile relay time was strong by scoring a time of 3:56.4. Members of the mile relay team were, Darryl Huskins, Jeff Bailey, Marty Johnson, and Jimmy Hughes.

Other outstanding athletes were Jeff Bailey in the Mile Run by finishing 1st in his heat out of 18 runners. Jeff's time was 5:05.1.

Our low hurdle time was also good because of Ricky Woody's performance. The high jump was well represented by Danny Bledsoe who cleared 5'8".

East Yancey Track Team and coach alike are very optimistic about our season. We plan on working hard, improving every meet, and making quite a showing at our conference meet their year. Our next meet is a 4 way meet with strong competition for Madison County High, Harris High, and Bowman High. The meet was held March 26.

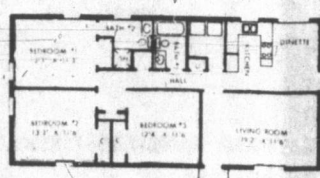
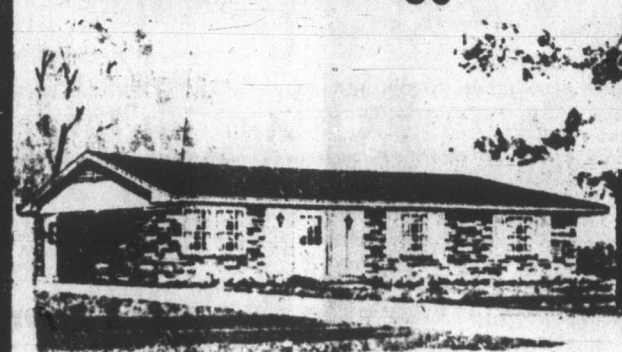
## PTA Basketball Game

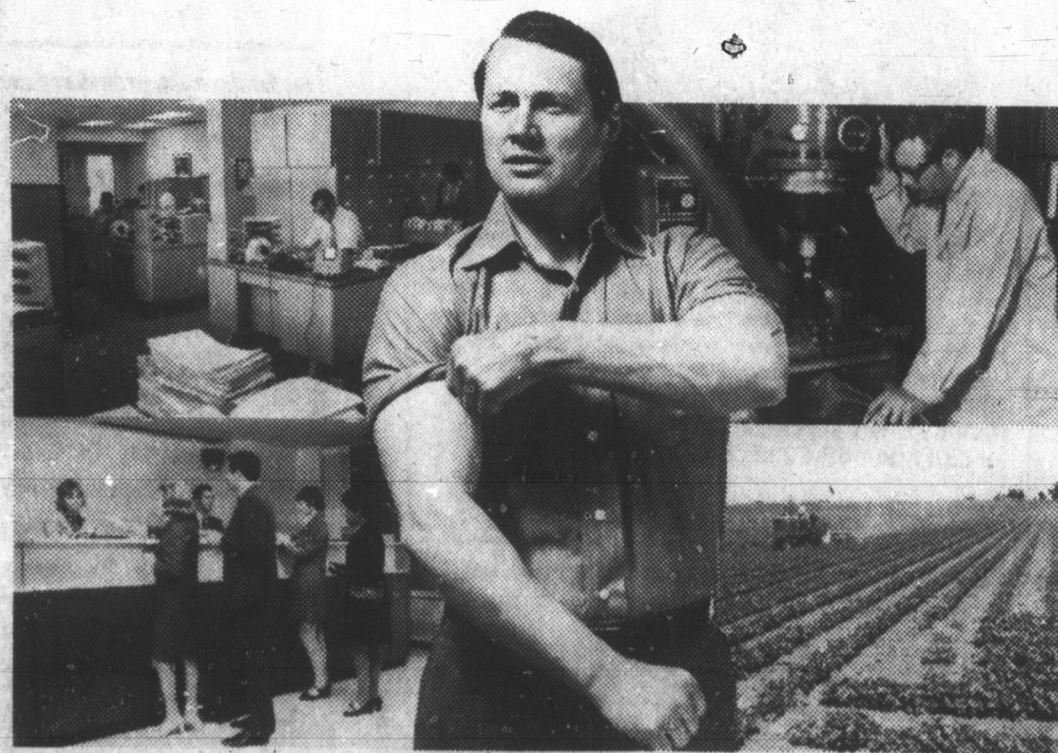
