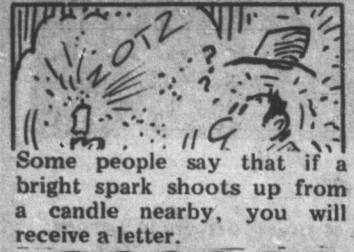


Annual Honeycutt Reunion Set

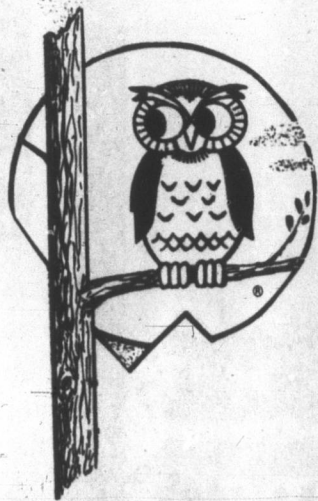

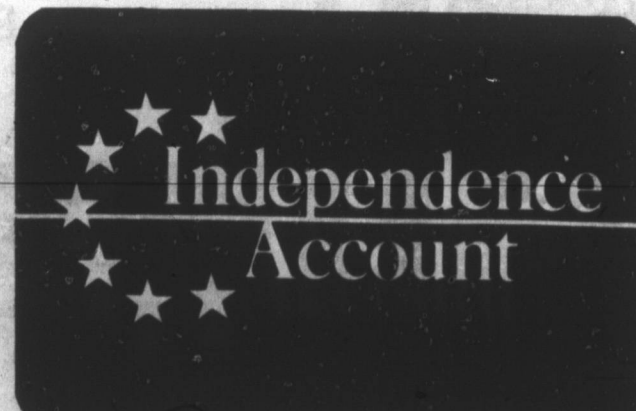
