**QUICK BLUEBERRY COFFEECAKE**

2 cups Rice Chex cereal (bite-size crispy rice squares) crushed to 1 cup  
1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar  
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon  
2 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted  
1 can (8 oz.) refrigerated biscuits  
1 can (15 oz.) blueberries, well drained

Preheat oven to 375°. Butter an 8-inch round cake pan. Combine cereal crumbs, brown sugar and cinnamon. Add butter. Mix well. Sprinkle half over bottom of pan. Arrange biscuits over crumb mixture. Top with fruit and then with remaining crumb mixture.
