
WILLIAM J. ROBINSON

Uniform Wage Law In Effect

[Cont'd from page 1] employee proper wages will, as of Thursday, be liable for the wages and additional damages to the employee.

"Although labor department officials regularly inspect businesses covered by the law, complaints by employees will receive top priority," said Labor Commissioner T. Avery Nye, Jr. The state minimum wage

and this new law apply to businesses with more than four employees and a gross volume of less than \$250,000. Businesses covered by the federal Fair Labor Standards Act are exempt from this law.


