Mayland Technical Institute recently submitted its annual statistical report to the GED Testing Service of the American Council on Education. This report covered the period from January 1, 1975 to December 31, 1975.

During this period, 99 people earned their GED certification at Mayland Tech-

nicol Institute. In addition to the people who earned their GED certificate at Mayland Tech, 27 inmates in the prison units in Avery and Yancey Counties also earned the GED certification. Since Mayland Tech became an official GED testing center in January, 1972, 264 people have earned their GED certification at the

center. The purpose of the GED Tests is to provide a valid means of measuring the educational proficiency of persons who have not completed 12 grades of formal school and comparing their educational development with high school graduates. Through achievement of satisfactory

scores on a battery of GED Tests, (English, natural science, social studies, literature, and math) adults may earn a high school equivalency credential, qualify for admission to college or other training programs, meet educational requirements for employment or promotion, satisfy education qualifica-

tions for induction into the Armed Forces of the United States and meet education requisites of state and local licensing boards for admission to licensing examinations for those occupations requiring educational competence at grade levels less than high school graduation.
