Preheat oven 350 degrees. In large bowl combine oats and buttermilk. Allow the oats to soak for 30 minutes or longer (Sometimes I will let them go overnight.) On a length of wax paper, sift flour, salt, baking soda and baking powder. Stir in shortening and beaten egg into oatmeal mixture. Blend in dry ingredients and mix only enough to moisten. Drop in brown sugar. Stir but don't beat. Ideally the brown sugar should remain suspended in the batter in small pea-size chunks. Spoon batter into muffin tins. Bake in 350 degree oven for 25 min. (until brown). Remove bread from oven. Turn from muffin tins and serve while they are hot.
