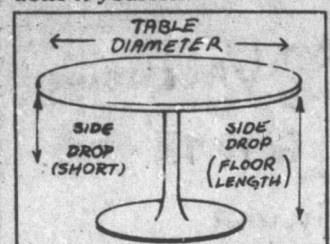


Hints For Homemakers:

Budget Table Decorations

Besides, you'll be able to point with pride at the finished product, when you've done-it-yourself.

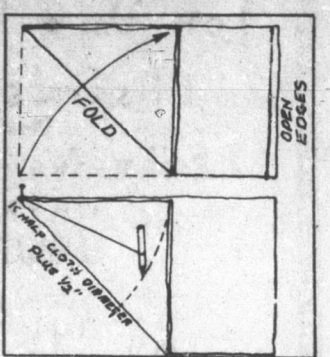


For example, you can turn the tables on your table settings by getting a tablecloth out of a sheet or bedspread. Just measure the table's diameter, add to that twice the length you want the cloth to drop down on the sides and one more inch for the hem. For a cloth up to 65 inches in diameter,

you'll need a twin sheet; up to 80 inches, a double sheet; up to 89 inches, queensize, and up to 107 inches, kingsize.

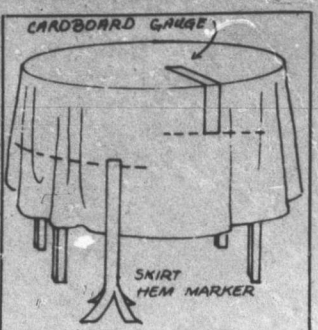
Fold the sheet in half lengthwise and then fold crosswise to form a rectangle four layers thick. Fold up one corner to the other side forming a triangle and rectangle combination with all the open edges facing the side opposite the fold.

Cut a non-stretchy cord to serve as a compass. Knot one end and pin-with-corsege pin to fabric. Tie a pencil on the other end. Length of cord should be half the diameter you want, plus 1/2 inch. Mark the outer edge of cloth and cut. Make a 1/2 inch hem.



The extra fabric can easily be turned into a set of matching napkins. Cut the fabric into squares of the

size you want and press a 1/4 inch hem all around. Turn the hem another 1/4 inch and stitch.

REQUEST FOR BIDS

The Yancey County and Town of Burnsville Community Development Program is receiving bids on 1300 feet of sewer pipe and accessories. Specifications are available at the Community Development Office in Burnsville.

in the **STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA** on the question of amendments to the Constitution of North Carolina

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to the qualified voters of Yancey County that the General Assembly of North Carolina has called a State election to be held in each County of the State of North Carolina on Tuesday, March 23, 1976 at which the questions of amending the Constitution of North Carolina will be submitted as follows:

QUESTION #1

FOR or AGAINST constitutional amendment to permit the General Assembly to enact general laws to authorize the State, counties, cities or towns, and other State and local governmental entities to issue revenue bonds to finance or refinance for any such governmental entity or any nonprofit private corporation, regardless of any church or religious relationship, the cost of acquiring, constructing and financing health care facility projects, such bonds to be payable from the revenues, gross or net, of any such projects and any other health care facilities of any such governmental entity or nonprofit private corporation pledged therefor.

QUESTION #2

FOR or AGAINST constitutional amendment to permit the General Assembly to enact general laws to authorize counties to create authorities to issue revenue bonds to finance, but not to refinance, the cost of capital projects consisting of industrial, manufacturing and pollution control facilities for industry and pollution control facilities for public utilities, and to refund such bonds, such bonds to be secured by and payable only from revenues or property derived from private parties and in no event to be secured by or payable from any public moneys whatsoever.

The submission of the Constitutional Amendments have been authorized by Chapters 641 and 826, respectively, of the 1975 Session Laws of North Carolina, subject to a favorable vote of a majority of the qualified voters of the State who shall vote on each question (amendment) in said election.

The polls for said election will be open from 6:30 A.M. to 7:30 P.M.; provided, however, that at voting places at which voting machines are used the County Board of Elections may permit the polls to remain open until 8:30 P.M.

Absentee ballots will be allowed in said election. In accordance with the general laws of the State of North Carolina, the times and places for registration and the names of the elections officials will be determined by the authorized officers of the County and information with reference thereto and as to the location of the voting places may be obtained from the County Board of Elections. Qualified voters who are not certain whether they are registered for this election should contact the County Board of Elections.

Middle-Age Gum Problems

Periodontal (gum) disease affects two out of three middle-aged Americans, accounting for about 75 percent of tooth loss after the age of 40. Although gum disease is one of the easiest to control if detected early, only 3.6 percent of all dental visits made during a one-year period were for gum treatment.

A problem that sometimes accompanies gum disease is dental hypersensitivity. A dentist speaking at a symposium on pain and sensitivity said this may be related to the fear of causing pain or injury with the toothbrush. "As a result, plaque accumulates, the gingival tissues become more tender and tend to

bleed, and the teeth become more sensitive," Dr. Abraham I. Chasens of the Fairleigh Dickinson University School of Dentistry said. Patients must be repeatedly assured that the little twinge of pain and bleeding that may accompany brushing will cause no harm, he said, and if they endure the initial discomfort, the symptoms will soon disappear.

Other reports indicate that special therapeutic dentifrices are designed to relieve the pain of teeth that are overly sensitive and thus help patients return to a regimen of good dental hygiene. One of these, Sensodyne, has been reported to help nine out of

ten patients. Good brushing is essential, Dr. Chasens said, because keeping teeth free of plaque is a common denominator to all other therapeutic efforts.
