How about having Bunny's favorite soup for lunch or supper. It's delicious!

BUNNY'S FAVORITE SOUP

By Bunny Gayer
Start with as much chicken and vegetable stock as you have. Add water and Bouillon cubes to make 3 quarts. Add some chopped cabbage and chopped carrot, chopped celery, green beans and black eyed peas, salt and pepper, parsley, rosemary, cooking sherry and worcestershire sauce. Cook 2 hours--add 1/2 package of very thin noodles and some chunks of chicken would be good too. Cook 2 1/2 hours.

CORN FRITTERS
2 cups corn--fresh or canned
1 tsp. salt
1/8 tsp. pepper

1 egg
1 tsp. melted fat
1/4 cup milk
2 cups flour
2 tsp. baking powder
Drop by teaspoonfuls into deep fat. Fry 2-3 minutes at 360-370 degrees.

GEORGE WASHINGTON PUDDING

1 (16 oz) can of red tart pitted cherries-undrained
1 1/2 cup sugar, divided
1/2 cup milk
1 tsp. baking powder
2 Tbsp. butter or marg.
Combine cherries and 1 cup sugar. Stir until sugar is dissolved. Combine 1/2 cup sugar, milk, baking powder and flour. Then blend until smooth. Melt butter in an 8 inch baking pan. Spoon in batter, spreading well. Pour cherry mixture over butter. Bake at 350 degrees for 45-55 minutes or until done. Serves 6 persons.
