## **Invited To Olympic Tryouts**

The Wrestlers from the North Carolina School for the Deaf Wrestling team have been invited to participate in the Olymp Tryouts for the Deaf to be held in Tuscon, Arizona June 16-19. Among the star members of the wrestling team is David Murphy, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Murphy of Route 1, Green Mountain. David, a senior at the N.C. School for the Deaf, ed the team three years ago just for kicks because Coach Harold Deuel needed a 112 lb. weight class wrestler. He became a good wrestler, this year winning 15 and losing 9 of his matches and showing much improvement.

One problem which faces the wrestling team is lack of funds to provide transportation, board and meals for the young men if they accept the invitation to the Olympic Tryouts for the Deaf. David Murphy, if he can attend the tryouts [which would cost about \$200 for each team member] has a g chance of winning and winners will travel to Europe in 1977 to participate in the World Olympics for the Deaf.
