Yancey Students Enter Mathematics Contest

Ten, Cane River High School students will be among the contestants at Western Carolina University's sixth annual High School Mathematics Contest, to be held April 29 in Hoey Auditorium at WCU. Contestants from East Yancey High School will number fourteen.

A total of 557 students from 42 WNC high schools will compete for top honors in four contest divisions--algebra I, geometry, algebra II, and comprehensive. The five highest-scoring contestants in each division will be awarded certificates of merit, and plaques will be presented to the three senior high schools and one junior high school whose students earn the highest average scores. In addition WCU Chancellor H.F. Robinson will present scholarship awards to the top winners in the senior level comprehensive division who

elect to attend WCU as freshmen.

The reception will be held at 4 p.m. Tuesday, May 4, at the Banquet Hall of the Asheville Civic Center.



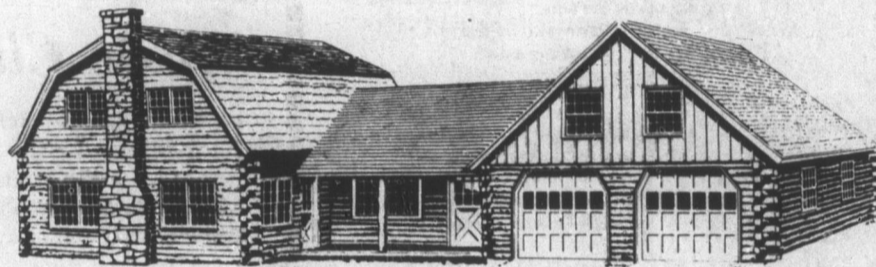
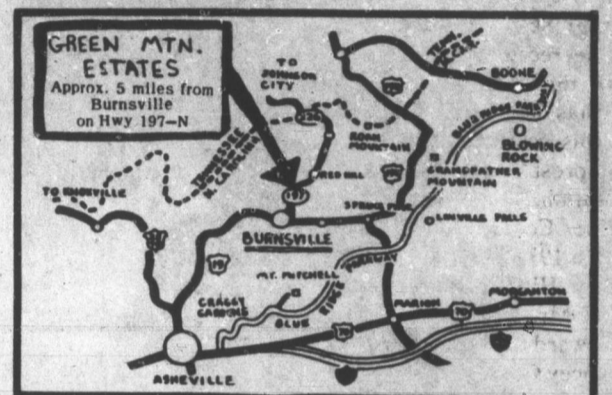
Birthday Party Given
