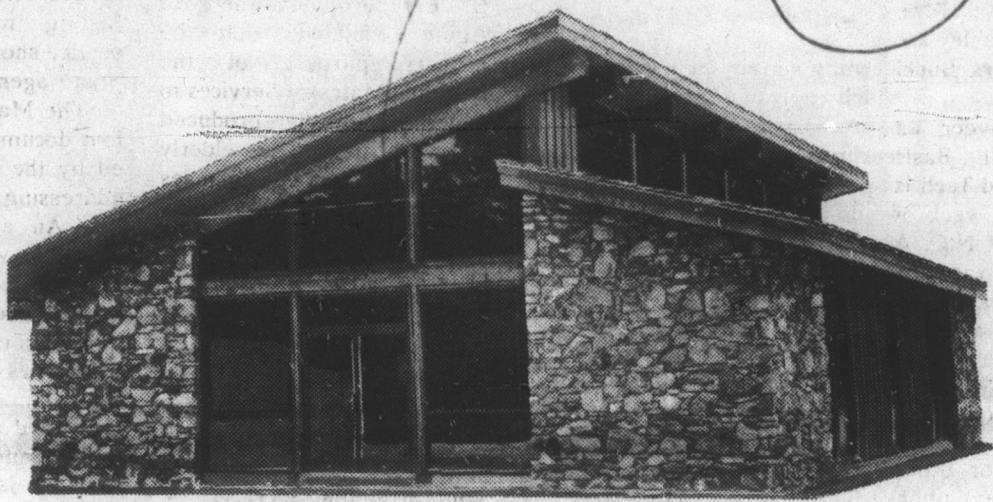
In the meantime Bingo continues on Wednesday nights at 7:30. You all come!
