The couple will reside in Celso.

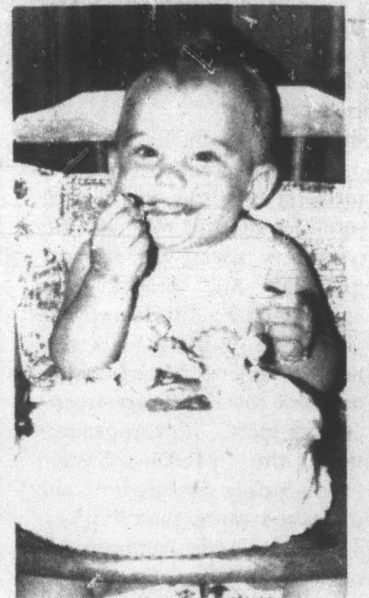
Concert Series Finale
