New Asheville Federal Office

Asheville Federal Savings and Loan will open a new office in Skyland, it was announced by Claude Drake, vice president.

The new office, which will be located in the Skyland Plaza on US 25, will serve customers in the South

Buncombe area. It is scheduled to open in mid-September. The early opening date is possible because the building is a modular structure. Manufactured by Diebold, Inc., it will arrive in sections that are complete down to the lamps in the lighting fixtures.

"We expect to be open for business within 15 working days after the modular structure arrives on site," Drake said.

The building is said to be the first of its type in the area. "Permanent manufactured buildings are a new and successful solution to the problem of expansion faced by financial institutions," said Drake. He noted that the planned building is an efficient way to quickly provide

financial services for a growth area such as Arden-Skyland.

Because the unique building and erection technique has attracted wide interest when used in other areas, the public will be informed of the building's arrival and invited to watch the assembly process, Drake said.

Asheville Federal Savings, which has assets of \$108 million, presently has offices in Black Mountain, Mars Hill and Asheville.

Follow these rules and avoid heat stroke

QUESTION: What is heat stroke and how can it be avoided?

ANSWER: Heat stroke, or sunstroke, occurs when the body can no longer rid itself of excess heat. It is caused as a result of excessive sweating and a consequent loss of body fluids and potassium with a resulting salt and chloride imbalance in the blood.

To avoid heatstroke work gradually into heavy exercise such as football

practice and steer clear of continuous potassium-depleting perspiration. Eat fresh fruits for potassium, take salt tablets only with a doctor's okay, drink 6-8 glasses of liquids daily, and refuse "quick energy" sugary snacks which may lower blood sugar.
