A number of very attractive and valuable contributions have been made to Mountain Heritage High School in recent weeks. A grouping of furniture for the reception area has been

donated by Henredon Furniture Manufacturing Company. The grouping consists of a couch, two chairs, end tables, a coffee table, and a desk. This grouping has greatly enhanced the recep-

tion area, and is being enjoyed by both students and visitors to the school.

A scoreboard and clock has been donated by the Northwestern Bank, to be used in the gymnasium. The

unit was purchased at a cost of \$1,065.00, and is expected to be installed soon.

A rather unusual contribution has been made by Ellis Moody. Through the years Mr. Moody had collected a sample of all minerals mined

throughout the state of North Carolina. This extremely valuable collection has been contributed to the school and will soon be displayed in the Science Department in a special showcase designed for this purpose. This collection will be very beneficial to students, not only in Science classes, but to all those interested in geology in any way.

James Padgett, architect for the project, has contributed two large potted plants for the Commons Area.

An invaluable contribution of time is being made by Ms. Jewell Loyless. She has volunteered her assistance in setting up the new library and has worked daily since work began on August 11. Her assistance will enable the students to have full access to the library much earlier than they would have without her assistance.

Steps for the amphitheater, and lumber for other purposes has been contributed by Banco Lumber Company.

A total of \$5,174.00 has been donated for auditorium seats. Seats are expected to be installed during the month of September.
