### Report Change In Income

Last month in the U.S. over 250,000 people who get supplemental security income (SSI) failed to report changes in circumstances that may affect SSI payments, according to Thomas L. Johnson, Field Representative in the Asheville Social Security Office.

Mr. Johnson said that studies show that people most often fail to report: (1) a move or a change in mailing address or living arrangements, (2) an increase or decrease in income (no matter where it comes from), (3) help from relatives or friends who pay utilities or provide free housing, (4) ownership of savings accounts or joint bank accounts that exceed \$1,500 for an individual or \$2,250 for a couple.

The SSI program makes monthly payments to people with little or no income and limited resources who are 65 or over or blind or disabled.

Reports can be made to any social security office by phone, mail or in person. An early report allows the office to make any necessary adjustments in payments without delay.
