Recently, the semi-annual meeting of The Northwestern District of the North Carolina Social Service Association was held at the First Baptist Church, Burnsville, with 45 persons present. The barbecue luncheon, catered by members of the Burnsville Lions Club, was prepared and served at Higgins Memorial United Methodist Church. According to Bill Haines, Lions Club President and Lion John C. McLain, the Burnsville Lions had a dual purpose: a community service project and a means of raising funds for the current White Cane drive.

White Cane funds help support the North Carolina Eye and Human Tissue Bank, Glaucoma-Diabetes Screening Clinics, Scholarships for the children of blind parents, Camp Dogwood for the Blind, Western North Carolina Lions Screening Clinic, gift radios and canes for North Carolina blind, research and service programs at three North Carolina medical schools, Northeast North Carolina Lions Mobile Unit, purchase of County Eye Clinic equipment; numerous other prevention of blindness programs and individual services to North Carolina blind.

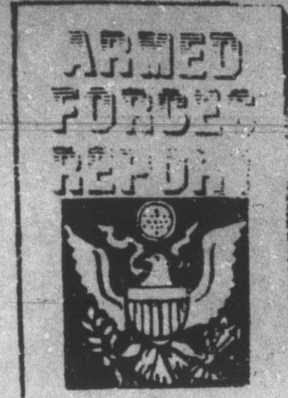
