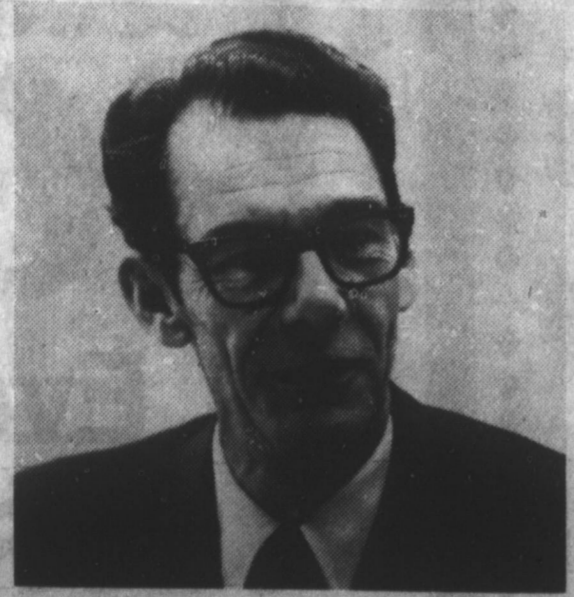


United In Marriage
