Fatal Accident Near Burnsville

A fatal one-car accident on Sunday, April 10 at 12:15 a.m. occurred 51/2 miles south of Burnsville on US 19E.

Kenneth W. Cariker, 33, of Asheville was driving a 1967 Volkswagon south on US 19E and entered a moderate left hand curve. The car left the roadway on the right and traveled 109 feet before overturning 3 times down the creek bank and into the water. The driver was not injured. One passenger, Cynthia Mary Pustorino, 22, of Asheville was killed.

Cariker was charged with driving under the influence and death by vehicle. Damage was estimated at \$300. Trooper W.J. Stallings investigated.

A one-car accident on NC 80S, 13 miles out of Burnsville occurred on Thursday, April 7, at 9:00 a.m.

Dennis Murphy, 20, of Route 5, Burnsville was driving a 1973 Ford on NC 80. He lost control of his vehicle near the northern end at the South Toe River bridge at approximately the center of the road. The vehicle traveled

to the left side of the road, back to the right side, off the right and struck a tree.

There were no passengers and no injuries. Murphy was charged with exceeding a safe speed. Damage was estimated at \$300. Trooper W.J. Stallings investigated.

A two-car accident occurred on Thursday, April 7 at 12:45 p.m. 5 miles north of Burnsville on Mine Branch Road in Newdale.

Connie Gouge, 25, of Spruce Pine was driving a 1974 Ford west on Mine Branch Road at a slow rate of

speed and met Lawrence Ray Higgins, 54, of Route 2, Burnsville driving a 1968 Ford. Higgins was traveling east at a slow rate of speed. The vehicles collided on their respective left front quarters. Due to the slow rates of speed there were no skid marks to determine the path of impact.

There were no other passengers in either vehicle and no injuries. Damage was estimated at \$550 to the Gouge Ford and \$300 to the Higgins Ford. Trooper W.J. Stallings investigated.
