On Southern Africa:

Mission Study Concluded

The mission study on the countries of Southern Africa was recently concluded by a group at Higgins Memorial United Methodist Church. The textbook "Torment to Triumph in Southern Africa" was the basis for the study led by Rev. Joe Ward. Mr. Ward, being very knowledgeable about the geography, culture, peoples and politics of Africa, aided the group to better understand the political, racial and economic struggles being experienced there.

Other participants in presenting information about Southern Africa were Charles Aldridge who spoke on conditions in Southwest Africa (Namibia), Betty Motesinger-Rhodesia; Phyllis Bailey-status of African women; Marvin Holland-Apartheid in South Africa; Mary Ann Wampler-Tribal Religions & the Protestant churches of South Africa; and InaBelle Sides who gave a special closing meditation on April 3.

The reports heard, filmstrips viewed, books read, questions asked, all helped the group as Christians to realize anew what it means to be part of the world wide mission of Christ's church. They shared together during the last session their views on what they can do individually and collectively to meet the challenge in Southern Africa.

According to a group spokesman, it was a stimulating, thought-provoking study which required participants to take a close look at their own failings and sharpened their vision about their own society.
