## NW Financial Meeting Held

The annual meeting of Northwestern Financial Corporation was held today in the Directors' Room of the Northwestern Bank in North Wilkesboro. Mr. Edwin Duncan, Jr., president, reviewed the performance of the Corporation in 1976 compared with other southeastern banking companies. Mr. Duncan also discussed expectations for 1977 and projected earnings of approximately \$1.70 per share.

In response to questions it was reported that the required divestiture of Northwestern Security Life Insurance Company and Northwestern Insurance Company is being

studied with outside consultants at this time. Progress was also reported on the possible settlement of the suit for recovery of taxes against the Internal Revenue Service.

One new director was elected, Mr. John P. Rostan III. Mr. Rostan is director of finance, Waldensian Bakeries, Inc., Valdese, N.C.

Following the Annual Meeting the Board of Directors voted to increase the quarterly cash dividend to 10 cents per share, an increase of 33.3 percent over the previous rate of 7 1/2 cents. The dividend is payable on July 1, 1977, to shareholders of record June 21, 1977.
