Delicious Fried Chicken is a favorite for the summer time...pair it up with potato salad and end the meal with lemon trifle for raves from the family or friends.

SOUTHERN FRIED CHICKEN/CREAM GRAVY
1 2 1/2-3 lb. broiler-fryer chicken, cut up
Salt
Pepper
2 cups all purpose flour
1 tsp. cayenne pepper
1 egg, beaten
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup (1 stick) butter

Season chicken pieces with desired amount of salt and pepper. Combine flour and cayenne pepper, mixing well. Mix together beaten egg and milk. Dip chicken pieces in egg mixture then dredge in flour mixture. Melt butter in large skillet; add chicken pieces. Cover and cook over medium heat approximately 30 minutes or until golden brown. Turn occasionally.

CREAM GRAVY
4 Tbsp. drippings
4 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
3 cups hot milk
1/8 tsp. salt
1/8 tsp. pepper
Remove drippings from skillet in which chicken was fried, leaving 4 T. Over medium heat, stir in flour until browned. Gradually add hot milk. Cook, stirring constantly until thickened. Add salt and pepper. Serve hot.
