CHICKEN/CREAM GRAVY 1 21/2-3 lb. broiler-fryer chicken, cut up

2 cups all purpose flour 1 tsp. cayenne pepper

1 egg, beaten 1/2 cup milk 1/2 cup (1 stick) butter

Season chicken pieces with desired amount of salt and pepper. Combine flour and cayenne pepper, mixing well. Mix together beaten egg and milk. Dip chicken pieces in egg mixture then dredge in flour mixture. Melt butter in large skillet; add chicken pieces. Cover and cook over medium heat approximately 30 minutes or until golden brown.
