

Mayland Tech Courses Offered

The Yancey Library will be the setting for a Creative Writing class soon to be offered by Mayland Technical Institute on October 5, 1977. Instructing the class will be

Francis Hulme, professor emeritus from the State University of New York, presently teaching at Warren Wilson College in Swannanoa and at Mars Hill College. Dr.

Hulme has been a prize winner in various verse competitions sponsored by the Poetry Council of North Carolina. He was the 1976 recipient of the Arnold Young

Cup (Poetry Council of N.C.) for best volume of verse for the year. Also in 1976 he received the Thomas Wolfe Literary Award.

Dr. Hulme has served as judge of various creative writing contests (verse and prose) for state and national contests, most recently for the Asheville Arts Journal senior citizen contest. Among his published works is Mountain Measure: A Southern Appalachian Verse Notebook, with photographs by Robert Amborg (Appalachian Consortium Press, 1975).

The Class will be held on Wednesday evenings from 7:00 until 9:00 p.m. and will be offered through November

Mayland Technical Institute will offer a course in Small Engine Repair beginning October 4, 1977 through December 6, 1977. The class will be held at the East Yancey Middle School each Tuesday evening from 6:30 p.m. until 9:30 for a period of ten weeks.

The course will consist of instruction in the maintenance repair of small engines

such as law mowers, tillers, motorcycles, etc. The instructor will be Guy Shuford. Mr. Shuford was the National Grand Champion winner of the one quarter mile races for three years.
