This location is larger than last year's site, the community room of the Northwestern Bank in Bakersville which became so crowded that bidding was difficult. "And now that it is an annual event, if we are as successful as we were last year, we will move the auction around to a different location each year in Mitchell or Yancey county," said Paul Welder, T.R.A.C. Board member, who made his debut as auctioneer last year, and will perform that job again this year. Welder says buyers will be offered a preview of the pieces which will be auctioned
