The opposition of the Phara-see to Christ's teaching began with Sabbath Day observance, They held the strict observance of the Mosaiclaw, while Christ preached spiritual observance. He pro-claimed that it is better to do good on the Sabbath day; to help the poor, heal the sick, and do generally good deeds after divine service, than to be idle and refraining from even the least efforts and work, He exposed their hypocritical interpretation of the Sabbath

day's journey, and other actions of every day life,

An other phase of opposition turned up and shortly after the execution of John the Baptist, The Pharasees suggested to him to leave for other teritories because King Herod would kill him . (Luke 12:31-33) Jesus' life was never threatened by King Herod. The Messiah was to be sacrificed by the Jews in Jerusalem, He therefore told those Pharasees that they tell "that Fox" that the King would never have the opportunity to harm him, How er from that time on he and his disciples visited several countries outside of Herod's

jurisdiction, Except for brief visits to m on feastdays Jesus journied in distant places. He traveled into the region of Tire and Sidon, and healed the daughter of a Greek woman. He made his headquarters in Capernaum, with side trips into the Decapolis and Peria regions. He travel-ed through Sameria, and introduced by a much married and devorced woman preached to the Samaritans for three

During all this period he preached and taught the preached and taught the doctrine of a spiritual kingdom in the cities and viliges of Palestine. Because of his fearless ministry he gathered more and more the wrath of the Church Authorities. It became soon evident that this disagreement should come to a climax. His disciples tried to protect him repeatedly from harm by keeping away from Jerusalem.
