CREATIVE COOKING

Ever let your imagination run wild when you're preparing a salad? I did, and I wound up "off the deep end." But in the process, I came up with a couple of creations that seem just right for party times or an informal get-together on the terrace or patio. The first one requires just a wee bit more effort than the second, but I think you—and your family and guests—will say they're both worth the time spent in preparing them.

PARADISE FRUIT PLATTER SALAD

1 can (1 lb. 14 oz.) Bartlett pear halves
2 cups (1 lb.) cottage cheese
3 slices pineapple
½ cup blueberries

1 red apple
1 avocado
2 bunches grapes
1 egg white, slightly beaten
Granulated sugar

Drain pear halves. Arrange crisp greens on large platter. Pile cottage cheese in center of platter and surround with pineapple slices, cut in half. Space pear halves around cottage cheese and fill centers with blueberries. Put wedges of unpeeled apple and peeled avocado between pear halves. Break grapes in small clusters. Dip in beaten egg white. Sprinkle with sugar. Distribute frosted grapes around platter. Serve with favorite fruit dressing. Makes 8 servings.

FROZEN FRUIT CHEESE SALAD

2 refrigerator trays
2 cups small curd cottage cheese, sieved
1 cup dairy sour cream
3 tablespoons confectioners sugar
½ teaspoon salt
1 cup drained pineapple tidbits

1 cut diced orange
1 cup chopped, pitted, cooked prunes
1 large banana, sliced
½ cup sliced maraschino cherries
½ cup chopped blanched almonds
Salad greens
Creamy Pink Dressing*

Blend cottage cheese lightly with sour cream, sugar, salt, pineapple, orange, prunes, banana, cherries and almonds. Pour into refrigerator trays, which have been rinsed in cold water. Freeze until firm. Allow to stand a few minutes before cutting into serving pieces. Place on salad greens. Serve with Creamy Pink Dressing* and garnish with a stemmed cherry and orange section.

***CREAMY PINK DRESSING**

Yield: 1 cup

1 cup dairy sour cream
2 tablespoons maraschino cherry juice

Blend sour cream with cherry juice; refrigerate until needed.
