Space pear halves around cottage cheese and fill centers with blueberries. Put wedges of unpeeled apple and peeled avocado between pear halves. Break grapes in small clusters. Dip in beaten egg white. Sprinkle with sugar. Distribute frosted grapes around platter. Serve with favorite fruit dressing. Makes 8 servings.


