The campers come from almost every state in the southeast. The camp day starts early by the lake. A salute to the flag opens the day's activities. From sunrise to sunset, the camper's day is


full of activity. Ten boys from Cherokee County and nine from Clay County will return from Camp Ney-A-Ti this Sunday.
