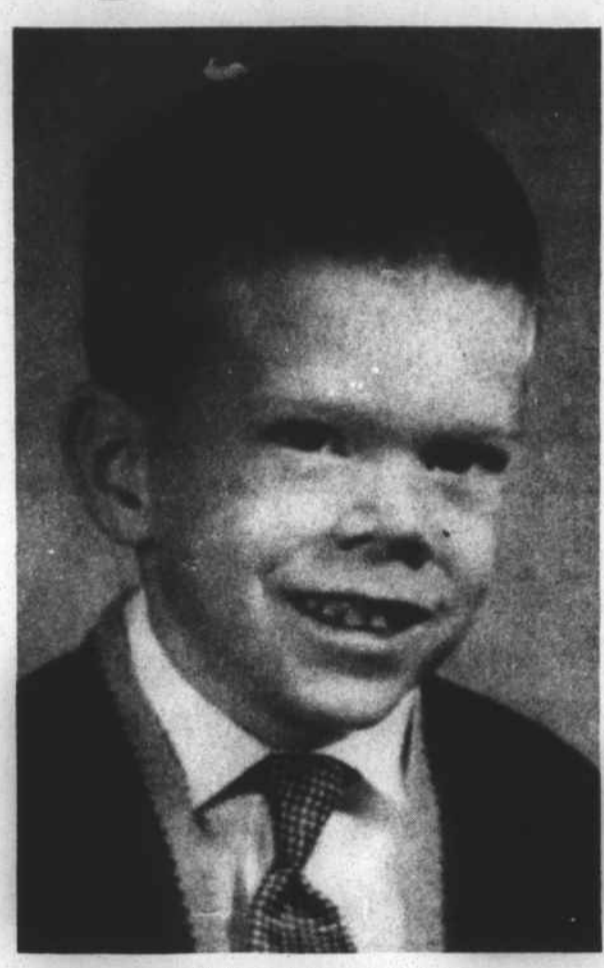
Top WNC 4-H's Honored

The Bourne family had been vacationing at Pawley's Island, located ten miles north of Georgetown, when Hubert was injured by a Roman candle that backfired, late Friday afternoon. Mrs. Bourne was with her son when the accident occurred.

COURT TERM OPENS; GRAND JURY REPORTS

The July term of Cherokee County Superior Court opened Monday, July 23 with the Honorable James C. Forthing presiding, and Solicitor Glenn W. Brown prosecuting for the state. #1100 State vs Lewis Smith, Break, enter & Steal, Alias Capias. #1105 - State vs Frank Whitaker-Forger - Alias Capias. #1112 - State vs Leon Lanning - V P L - Due to the fact that the defendant is now serving a term in the Federal Prison, this case is continued. #943 - State vs Robert Earl Kincaid-Good Behavior Shown, Continued under former order. #1136 - State vs Gerald (Bud) Jones - Forgery - Defendant pleads guilty, Judgment consolidated with #1142. #1142 - State vs Gerald (Bud) Jones-Break, enter and Steal - Larceny (over the value of \$200.00) - Defendant enters a plea of guilty to Larceny of goods of more than \$200.00 value, to the second count in the bill, and in view of that plea, State takes a Nol Pro on the first count charging Breaking and entering. Cases 1142 and 1136 are consolidated for judgment. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant be confined in the State's Prison at Raleigh for a term of not less than 3 nor more than 5 years.

COURT TERM OPENS; GRAND JURY REPORTS

Grand Jury again for their fine spirit of helpfulness and co-operation. Respectfully, W. A. Singleton, Foreman. Court adjourned to convene at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday morning, July 24, 1962. #1135 - State vs Dallas Ray Patterson - Not a True Bill-Manslaughter. #1132 - State vs Haskell Donaldson - Escape - Defendant pleads guilty to an escape. Sentenced to 6 months. #1109 State vs Broadus Carringer - Manslaughter - Jury Trial. At the close of the State's evidence Defendant through his attorney, Leonard Lloyd withdraws his plea of Not Guilty and enters a plea of Guilty of Involuntary Manslaughter. It is the judgment of the Court that the Defendant be confined in the State's Prison at Raleigh for a term of not less than 3 years nor more than five years. This sentence is suspended, by and with the consent of the Defendant and his counsel, Hon. Leonard Lloyd, given in Open court for a period of 5 years from this date, to-wit: the 24th day of July, 1962, and the Defendant placed on probation under the general terms of the probation judgment, and the following in addition thereto: 1. That he pay the costs of his action. 2. That he pay into the office of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Cherokee County the amount of \$682.00 for the use and benefit of Mrs. Jocie Phillips and Mrs. R.L. Phillips, and to be disbursed one half to each. 3. That he not drink, sell, buy, transport, or possess any intoxicating beverages of any kind. 4. Not manufacture intoxicants during said 5 yr. period. 5. Surrender his drivers license to the Clerk of Sup. Court. 6. Not operate a motor vehicle upon the public highways for a period of 5 years from his date.
