Six Murphy Youths Receive Senior Life Saving Awards

Safety in and on the water and the ability to assist or rescue a person in danger of drowning are based fundamentally upon two things, knowledge and skill, and neither are in itself sufficient to meet the needs of the individual. Requirements for this course are very strict. Students must be able to swim at least 440 yards continuously, dive from surface to minimum depth of six feet and swim two body lengths under water, tread water one minute with hands beneath surface, float motionless or rest in a floating position for one minute, and at least 17 hours of class work.

Jerry Cox, instructor, just recently completed his instructor's course at The American Red Cross Aquatic School at Brevard, N.C. He says this school is really tough and some very fine instructors are turned out. He volunteered his services and came down from Andrews each day to Murphy in order to teach this course this summer.

This is in keeping with the Red Cross services. The American Red Cross is justly proud of its Water Safety Service. It has established and maintains a unique water safety educational system that has proved its worth many times over. It is proud of its volunteer instructors, a small army itself, and of the excellent work they have done in the past years of service by the groups have produced a multitude of trained lifesavers fit and willing to aid those in danger of drowning. Records of the strides which have been made in lifesaving, if written, would fill volumes with accounts of their achievements in saving life.


New Clay FHA Supervisor Assumes Duties

While the Chickamauga - East Cleveland 161 KV line was energized under a caution order, a pre-formed patch rod was installed at the point where a model airplane made contact with the conductor some time ago. The insulators were also changed with the line hot. The vendor for the new equipment did the actual work and area TVA personnel observed. Foreman Savage was given an opportunity to ride the bucket to get an understanding of its possibilities. Savage is shown in the boom-bucket rig above. He commented that the new equipment is the safest he has ever seen. After the demonstration, Savage attended a foremen's meeting in Knoxville.
