# Taylor Says No Action Taken Admission Fees To National Forests And Parks This Year

The House Interior Committee will take no action this year on the conservation fund bill which could have resulted in the charging of admission fees for use of federally-owned park, parkway and forest recreation areas in Western North Carolina, reports Congressman Roy A. Taylor.

As a member of the Interior Committee and National Parks Subcommittee, Rep. Taylor has led a fight against imposition of fees for the use of the Blue Ridge Parkway, Great Smoky Mountains National Park, Pisgah and Nantahala National Forests.

In a newsletter being sent to some 22,000 persons on the Congressman's mailing list, he declared: "I have spoken out against the proposal; submitted statements against it; talked with individual members of the committee; and invited citizens from Western North Carolina to appear before the committee and testify against the fees."

"For the moment, we have won a definite victory," said Rep. Taylor.

He warned that the bill "will likely come up again during the next session of Congress," and pledged to continue his efforts to prevent the imposi-

tion of any type of fees for the use of federal recreation areas in WNC.

The newsletter includes excerpts from Interior Committee minutes where Rep. Taylor secured from Interior Secretary Udall the pledge that special consideration would be given to Western North Carolina recreation areas should a fees bill be passed.

The congressman said in his newsletter that he was including the statements because "I want Western North Carolina people to know exactly what Secretary Udall said."

Mr. Taylor: First, Mr. Secretary, I would like to say that no state is prouder of its national parks and parkways than we in N.C.

Secretary Udall: No state has a better relationship with the Interior Department than yours.

Mr. Taylor: Mr. Secretary, I believe you are familiar with the fact that the North Carolina parks were acquired and developed as a result of joint state and federal contributions.

Secretary Udall: Yes, Mr. Taylor: You are also familiar with the fact that this joint program has created certain unusual circumstances, problems equities

and obligations which would need to be considered in deciding whether to impose fees on parks and roads in North Carolina.

Secretary Udall: Yes, North Carolina is unique and its parks have been acquired in a manner creating special circumstances. We would certainly consider whether this creates a situation where, a particular recreation area North Carolina cars with N.C. license ought to have the right to use local areas (with out charge).

Mr. Taylor: In the Great Smokies, the States of North Carolina and Tennessee, administered by the Rockefeller Foundation donated the land to the government along with certain state roads. Some of these roads were transferred under deed containing provisions that fees would never be charged. Would these facts be taken into consideration?

Secretary Udall: I am well aware of some of these special situations and facts and would want to evaluate them if the federal government made a commitment on some of these roads, I think those commitments ought to be kept.

Mr. Taylor: You are aware that more than half of the land for the Blue Ridge Parkway was donated by private individuals after news stories and editorials appeared ascribing them that this would be a free-access road and the would not be charged to use it.

Secretary Udall: Yes, I am cognizant of that history, I do not think of any state which through money and land has contributed more than N.C. This is a fact that we are conscious of because we have some of the finest areas of the park system in N.C.
