Brazilian Violinist to Perform

YOUNG HARRIS - A renowned Brazilian violinist, currently making his first professional tour of the United States, will perform at Young Harris College on Friday, November 9.

Senhor Alberto Jaffe will present a concert in the Susan B. Harris Chapel at 8:00 p.m. A first prize winner of many competitions in his native country, Senhor Jaffe has toured extensively throughout Spain, Israel, and other European countries. He entered his first national competition at the age of eleven and won the honor of appearing as guest soloist with the Brazilian Symphony Orchestra.

He was the winner of the Brazilian division of the Jeunesses Musicales competition and was selected as first violinist in the international orchestra at the World's Fair in Brussels. He is now completing a three-volume edition of six Bach violin and piano sonatas.

Senhor Jaffe will be assisted at the piano by his talented wife, Daisy de Luca, who has also won many prizes in Spain, Germany, and her native Brazil.

The program of the Brazilian violinist will consist of C Major Sonata, K 296, Sonata, Sonatina, Canto do Cisne Negro, Sonata in A Major, Mozart, Debussy, Barrok, Villa Lobos, and Franck.
