**USS ROWAN** - Terry D. Nelson, boilerman firstclass, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Dent K. Nelson of Route 1, Hayesville, N. C., is serving aboard the destroyer USS Rowan, part of the combined First Fleet force involved in Exercise Night Stick off the coast of California.

The exercise in anti-submarine and anti-air warfare techniques began Dec. 10, and lasted five days.

Eighteen ships and several aircraft units were involved in Exercise Night Stick, which was coordinated by Vice Admiral R. T. S. Keith, Commander First Fleet. The ships included aircraft carriers, a heavy cruiser, a nuclear submarine, 11 destroyers, a minesweeper and three auxiliary ships.

The exercise was aimed at maintaining the overall readiness of the units involved and to develop their preparedness for duty in the Western Pacific with the Seventh Fleet. The operation centered around a fast carrier striking force supported by an anti-submarine warfare group. They were opposed by aircraft and submarines. The aircraft used included jets and propeller-driven ranging in size up to medium bombers.

# FINAL NOTICE

The N. C. Law Says You Must List ALL Your Property Accurately For Taxes During January . . . Failure In Accuracy or On Time Means An Added Penalty The Law Roads, In Part

It shall be the duty of every person, firm or corporation in whose name any property or poll is to be listed under the terms of this subchapter, to list said property or poll with the proper list taker or the supervisor, within the time allowed by law, on a list setting forth the information required by this subchapter. In addition to all other penalties prescribed by law, any person, firm or corporation whose duty it shall be to list any poll or property, real or personal, who willfully fails or refuses to list the same within the time allowed by law, or who removes or conceals property for the purpose of evading taxation, shall be guilty of misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) or imprisonment not to exceed thirty days. The failure to list shall be prima facie evidence that such failure was willful. (1957, c. 848).
