STAGE PERFORMANCE PRAISED BY CRITICS - Murphy's Charlton H. Holder, the son of Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Holder of Murphy, played the part of Gaston LeChaille, Gigi's suitor, in the romantic comedy of an entrancing child-woman.

The play opened April 4 and was acclaimed another hit for the Island Players in the Tampa and Sarasota, Fla., newspapers.

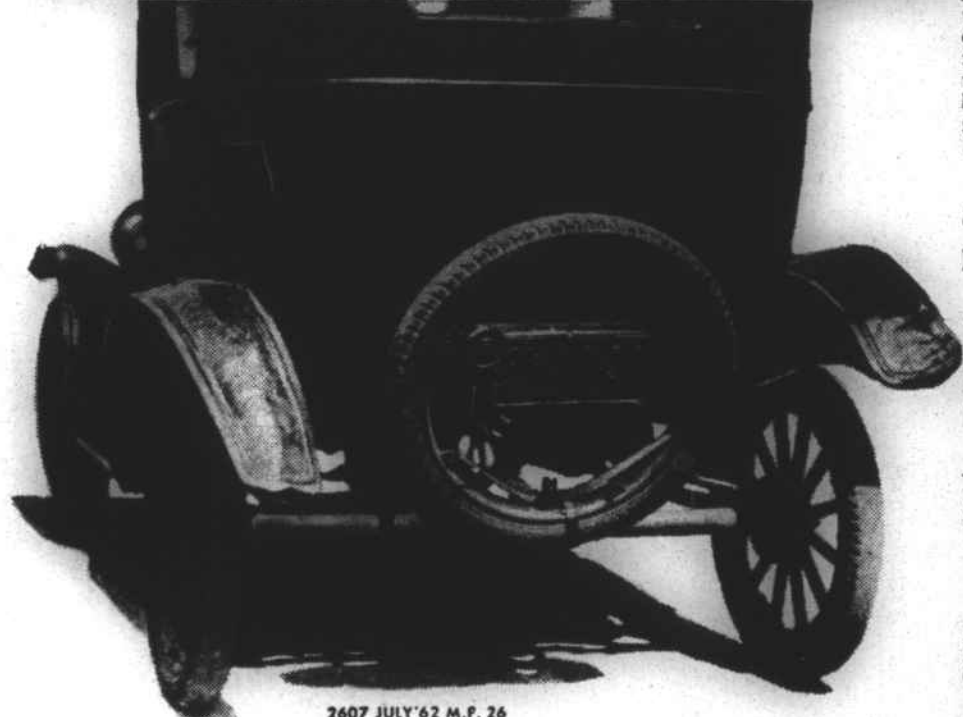
