22 Road Projects Completed In Two County Area

ROBBINSVILLE — State Highway Commissioner Ted Jordan reports the completion of 22 road improvement projects in Cherokee and Clay Counties during the month of April.

In Cherokee County these roads were strengthened: 0.90 mile Potato Creek; 1.00 mile Pack Mountain; 1.00 mile Gold Branch; 1.90 miles Laney Road; 2.14 Pisgah from SR 1505 to 1388; 1.78 miles Fairview from 1605 to Andrews City Limits; 0.23 mile from Andrews City Limits to SR 1519; 5.45 miles Granview from 1326 to 1337; 0.15 mile Hanging Dog School off SR 1331; 1.20 Texanna from 1326 to 1326; 0.15 mile Colored School from 1363 to end of pavement; and 0.81 mile Murphy School.

These Clay County roads were improved: 1.29 miles F. School Road, from US 64 to end of pavement; 1.36 miles Oak Forest from US 64 to 64; 1.65 miles Wonderview Road from end of pavement to SR 1148; 0.34 mile Wonderview from US 64 to 1147; 0.45 mile Hiwassee Street from US 64 to end of pavement; 0.5 mile Ritter Road from 1309 to 1300; 0.6 mile SR 1140 from US 64 to 1145; 2.47 miles Old Brassstown Rd. from US 64 to SR 1100; and 3.33 miles SR 1140 from NC 69 to SR 1145.

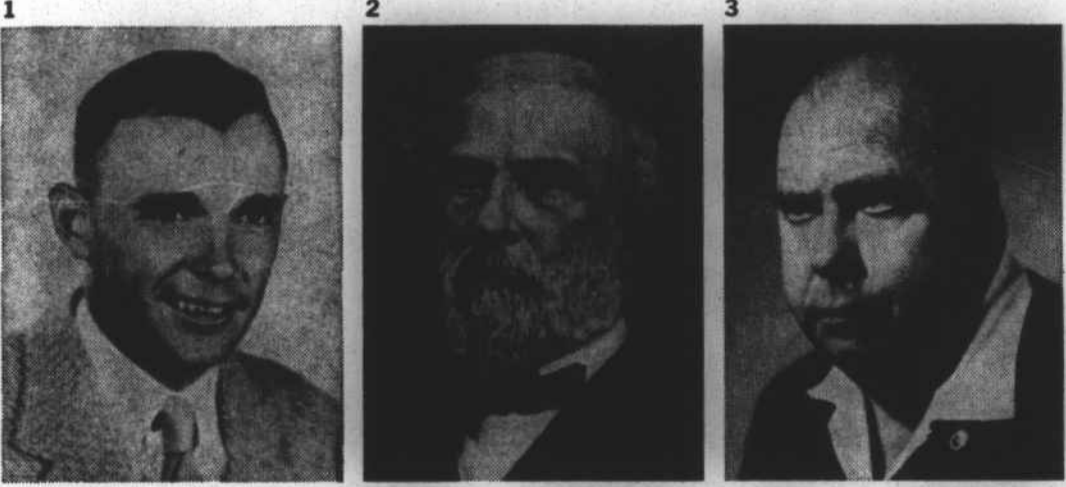
