**Town of Murphy PROPERTY OWNERS**

Upon motion by W. A. Singleton, duly seconded by Kenneth Godfrey, the following was unanimously passed by the Board: That an ordinance be adopted as follows for the regulation and control of the use of real property in the Town of Murphy so as not to encroach upon rights and privileges of others or to cause depreciation of adjoining or nearby property owners. This ordinance will be effective June 1, 1963.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to erect any building or structure or to change the use of any building or structure or of any piece of land without having first obtained a permit for same.

The Mayor and Town Council shall appoint a Board to be known as the "Building and Property Use Board" consisting of three members of the citizens of Murphy whose duty shall be to study and review each permit request and to approve or deny such request. The Board shall be invested with full authority to make such decision. The Board members may be members of the Town Council. The Board shall have authority to call witnesses, hear petitions, to cause petitions to be advertised, to notify interested parties.

Authority to advertise or notify others does not imply any responsibility to do either unless in the judgement of the Board, such action is necessary to protect the rights of others.

Any person, firm or corporation erecting any building or structure or changing the use of any building or structure or of any piece of parcel of land without first obtaining a permit shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$50.00 and imprisonment of not more than 30 days. Violation or the existence of a violation each day shall constitute a separate violation and subject to the same penalty.

Failure of the board to act upon a petition within 30 days from date of receipt shall be considered approval unless the Board needs additional time to study the merits of the petition and the petitioner be so advised.
