Lidseen Announces Company Promotions

HAYESVILLE - Lidseen of North Carolina, Inc., announced this week the promotions of two company executives. Edwin Lidseen, president of the company, announced Monday, May 13, that Arthur C. Murray will assume new duties as vice-president in charge of sales and Guy Brittain, who has been master mechanic, will assume charge of manufacturing in addition to shop supervisor.

Mr. Murray has been with the company for five years and has been in charge of manufacturing. He and his wife, Alice, are residents of Hayesville and have four children, two of whom, Connie, 10, and William, 15, are still at home. They are just completing a new home on Lake Chatuge.

welded push bottom oilers. Lidseen's "Buster" strapbreakers "snap steel straps as easy as 1-2-3." Still another product of the Clay County plant are metal mold bake pans. These stainless steel bake pans come in five sizes, 1 lb., 4 lb., 6 lb., 8 lb., and scrapple. These pans have been adopted by the nation's largest meat packers as standard equipment.

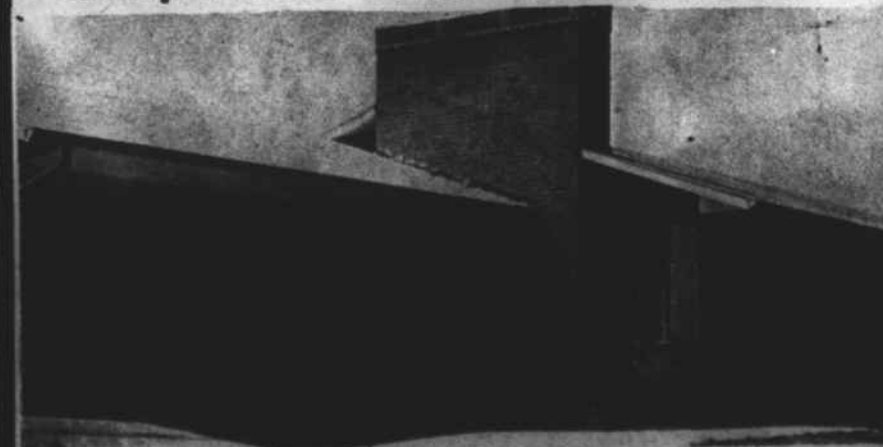
