

Ga. Mountain Fair Opens 13th Season On Monday

HIWASSEE, GA. - The Georgia Mountain Fair, Hiwassee's "Crossroads Where Old Friends Meet," will open its doors on Monday, August 12 for the 13th consecutive year featuring one of the most unique festivals of mountain products and perceptive native skills in the nation.

One of the last of the old-timey fairs, the event encourages folks in the Georgia and North Carolina mountains to show off their most cherished antiques, and their proudest possessions, their prettiest handwork, and their prize cattle.

On display all week will be one of the finest collections of Cherokee Indian arrowheads and artifacts.

There will be on exhibit one of the world's largest collections of sapphires and the largest opal in the world. Also the fair will boast the largest

collection of Georgia amethysts mined right in Towns County.

Among the new attractions this year is an authentic "liker still set up and operating.

The second annual Fair Parade will begin at 12:00 noon on Saturday and will feature covered wagons, horse-back riders, and people in pioneer dress.

Following is the schedule for events at the fair:

Monday, Aug. 12 - The fair opens its doors for the 13th consecutive year.

Tuesday, Aug. 13 - A flower show opens at 2 p.m., and continues through noon, Thursday.

Wednesday, Aug. 14 - Georgia Mountain Youth Day, a special day for 4-HFFA, FHA Scouts, and all youth organizations.

Thursday, Aug. 15 - Lions Club and Rock Hound Day, when all Lions Clubs are welcomed.

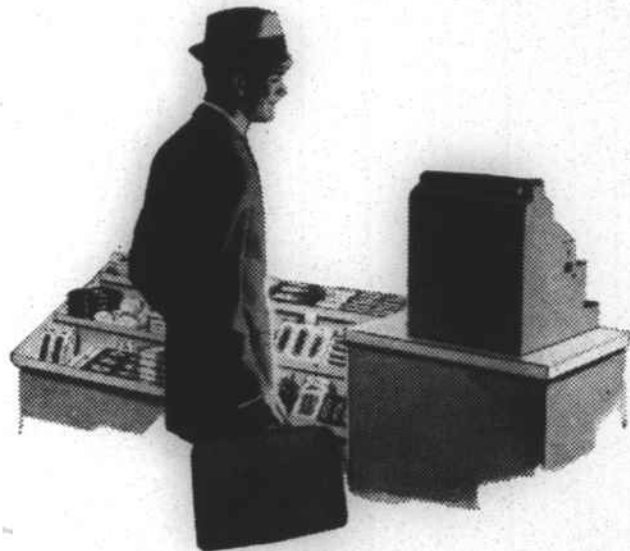
