### Andrews Town Board Sets \$130,000 Bond Election For Nov. 16

ANDREWS - In a meeting here Monday night the Town Board of Aldermen voted to set Nov. 16 as the date for a \$130,000 bond election to finance the town's portion of a new sewage system and disposal plant, an extension and enlargement of the town's water supply system, and a new recreation center.

The breakdown on the amount of the money needed for each item was listed as follows:

- \$70,000 for the sewage system improvements.
- \$25,000 for the water system improvements.
- \$25,000 for the recreation center.

Three fourths of the money for all the projects is being provided through grants from the federal government.

In order to receive the grants, voters in the city limits must approve the town's \$130,000 portion.

Registration books will be open from Fri., Oct. 25, until Saturday, Nov. 2, with the final day listed as challenge day.

Mrs. Cleve Almond will be registrar for the election which will be held at City Hall.
