The County Extension Office has publications which will give workable plans for equipment and buildings needed by livestock producers. One of these publications is made up by several universities and published by the Midwest Plan Service. This complete beef cattle

plan book can be obtained from the County Agent's office at the cost of one dollar. Another publication by the

USDA gives some practical ideas on equipment for beef cattle. This publication is available free.

The North Carolina Extension Service has building plans for various types of livestock equipment including: holding chutes, corrals, and feeding barns.

Livestock farmers needing plans to do a specific job can look at the building plans available in County Extension office and order the plans needed free of charge.

Cherokee County farmers might well take a look at their present feed supply to find out if they will have sufficient feed to carry them through the winter.


