Clay Cancer Crusade Chairman Appointed

HAYESVILLE - The appointment of Mrs. William T. Groves to lead the American Cancer Society's 1964 - Crusade in Clay County was announced this week by the Society's Clay Chapter.

Unit President Howard Martin, in naming the new chairman, said that "under the vigorous leadership of Mrs. Groves we hope to have our most successful educational and fund-raising Crusade ever."

In accepting the top Crusade post in this area, the chairman called on everyone "to do his part in the fight against cancer." She noted that the disease will eventually strike some 48,000,000 Americans now living, according to present rates.

"All of us," she said, "either directly or indirectly are destined to be touched by the suffering caused by cancer. Therefore all of us must unite against the disease." The fund-raising aspect of the Crusade, she said, provides the support for the Society's programs of research, education and service to cancer patients.
