

Andrews Little League Reorganized

ANDREWS - The Andrews Little League program has been reorganized this spring, and the four teams, Hawks, Rebels, Spark Plugs, and Wolf Pack, are looking forward to one of their best years.

New officers for this season are: Marion Ennis, President; Dr. F. E. Blalock, Vice - President; Charles Delaney, Secretary - Treasurer; Joe Sursavage, Player Agent and serving on the Board of Directors will be Harold Jones, Fred Liles and Houston Ledford.

There will also be three new sponsors who are equipping the teams with complete new uniforms and equipment. They are as follows: Sam Jones Realty Co., Nichols Department Store and Citizens Bank and Trust Co. Owenby Mfg. Co., one of the original sponsors, will continue to sponsor the Hawk team with all new equipment also.

Patricia Moffitte Dies After 8 Month Coma

ANDREWS - Mrs. Patricia Thomasson Moffitt, 32, a native of Andrews, died Wednesday, April 22, at 7:30 p.m. at Sunset Hill Convalescent Home at High Point, N. C. She is survived by her husband, Capt. David Moffitt of Fort McPherson, Ga., a daughter, Catherine Jo Ann, age 3, and father, John Henry Thomasson of Kelly, N. C.

A graduate of Andrews High School and WCC, Cullowhee, she taught three years in the Winston Salem Schools before traveling abroad, teaching two years in Europe. While in Germany she married Capt. David H. Moffitt, later returning to the states and took up residence at Fort Sill, Okla., where they spent two years before transferring to Anchorage, Alaska.

One year ago she came to Andrews to visit her grandmother, Mrs. Jo Ann Holloway, who was ill, and was stricken on her return trip to Anchorage with encephalitis. She was flown from

Alaska to Letterman General Hospital in San Francisco, Calif., where she remained in a coma for a period of eight months. She regained consciousness for a short period of time and was later entered in the convalescent home until her death.

Floral offerings from many states, including Alaska, arrived at the Irvie Funeral Home in Andrews on Saturday from friends, former students, and people who had met her in many walks of life.

Services were held at the Valleytown Baptist Church on Saturday afternoon at 3:00 with the Rev. Edward Whitson and the Rev. Roy Goodson officiating.

Interment followed in the family plot of Valleytown Cemetery.
