D. C. Smart Completes **DHIA** Training

MARTINS CREEK- D. C. Smart of the Martins Creek Community has recently com-pleted the DHIA training at North Carolina State College. Mr. Smart is one of the first from this area to complete the training which he will use in testing dairy herds in Cherokee and Clay Counties.

The Dairy Herd Improvement Association is an organization made up of dairymen for the purpose of getting production and feed records kept on their herds.

The DHIA program helps the dairymen get his opera-tion on a business-like basis. It helps him determine income from milk, amount of feed fed, feed costs, return over feed costs, calving dates, and other individual cow records. All this information is compiled with an IBM system monthly.

Dairymen interested in participating in this program can find out the particulars from the County Extension Office of D. C. Smart.
