Information On Drivers Education

MURPHY- The 1963 General Assembly passed a law requiring new drivers under 18 years of age to complete an educational course before applying for a drivers license and providing faster suspension of the license of all drivers under 18 years of age for moving violations.

Joe Sherrill, who works with the Department of Motor Vehicles said this week that this course provided by the Department is primarily for persons between the ages of 15 years and nine months and eighteen whose high schools do not regularly offer driver education.

Students enrolled in schools which offer driver education will be required to have special permission from their school principals in order to attend the Department of Motor Vehicles Course.

The course includes eight hours of classroom instruction only. It does not include training behind the wheel and does not fulfill requirements of insurance companies for reduced rates for males under twenty-five who complete formal driver education courses.

Those who wish to enroll must produce a copy of their birth certificate and complete an enrollment form at the office of the local Driver License Examiner.

The applicant will receive a letter to his parents or guardian indicating the location, date, and time of the course. In some cases he may be notified later by post card of the course's location and hour.

Mr. Sherrill said that another course will begin as soon as enough people are enrolled. These courses supplement the high school courses offered here.

Mr. Sherrill suggested that interested students should contact Eugene Cooke, license examiner, in the courthouse on Mondays and Tuesdays.
