## CORN AVAILABLE TO CLAY COUNTY LIVESTOCK OWNERS

A supply of CCC-owned corn is now available for delivery to eligible farmers. This corn is being made available at a reduced price for purchase by farmers who do not have adequate feed supply due to the adverse weather conditions which have prevailed throughout the 1964 crop year.

Any owner of dairy and/or beef cattle, sheep, hogs or work stock, who does not have adequate feed supply, may apply at the ASCS office to purchase this corn.

Clay Milling Company and Wells Mobile Milling have been approved by the county committee to handle this corn. The grain may be purchased as shelled corn or ground and mixed, as desired.

Interested livestock owners should visit the office for further information, and to file their applications.

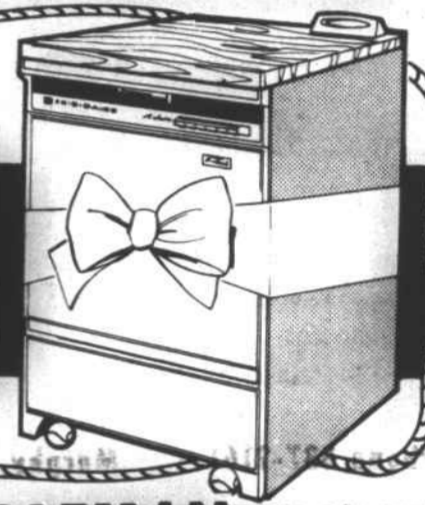
