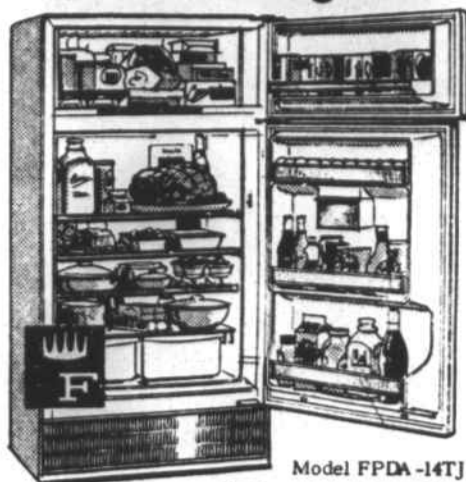

NOTICE

As of June 14 the Murphy Town Board passed an ordinance as follows:

No person shall discharge or cause to be discharged any storm water, ground water, roof runoff, subsurface drainage, cooling water, or unpolluted industrial process waters to any sanitary sewer.

The penalty for the violation of this order was contained in section 901 which reads as follows:

"Any person who shall violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance or who shall counsel, aid, or abet any such violation or failure to comply, shall be deemed guilty of an offense and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed fifty dollars or by imprisonment not to exceed thirty days."

For more complete information on this ordinance, it may be viewed at the Town Hall.

This sewer ordinance becomes effective on August 1, 1965.

The Town Board requests your cooperation in the immediate correction of all drainage which is now in violation of this ordinance.

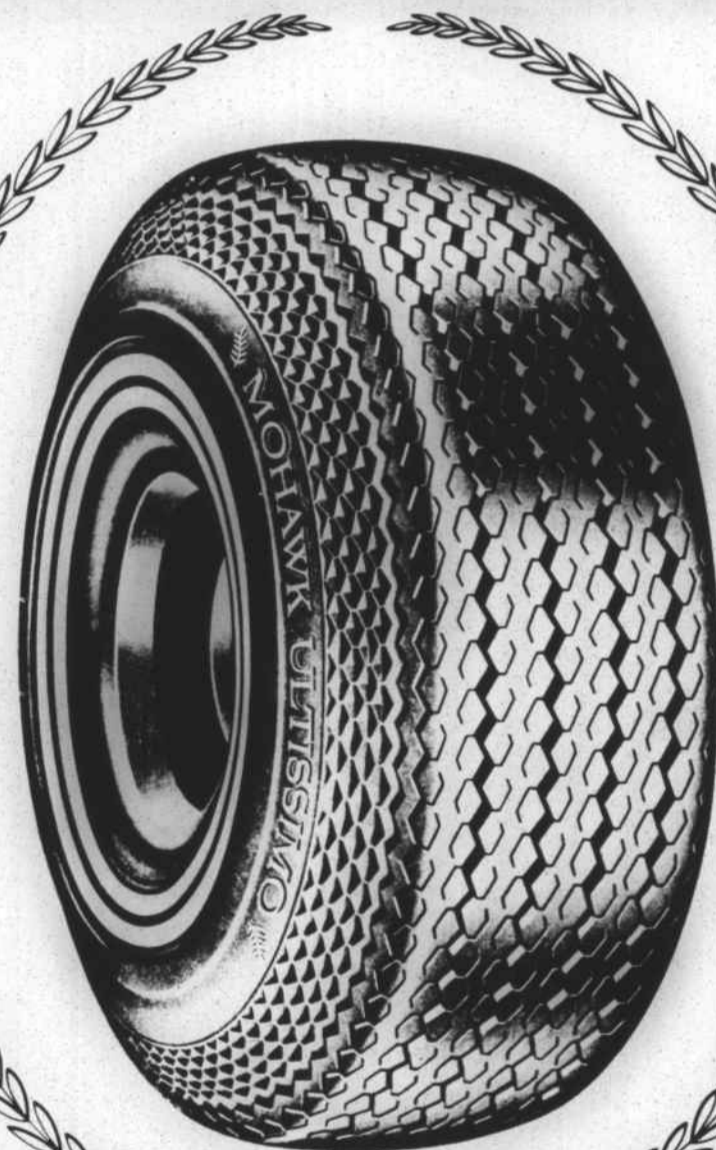
