Mrs. Margaret Bruce presented the program "Woman's Place in The World Today". Plans were made for a fund raising project.

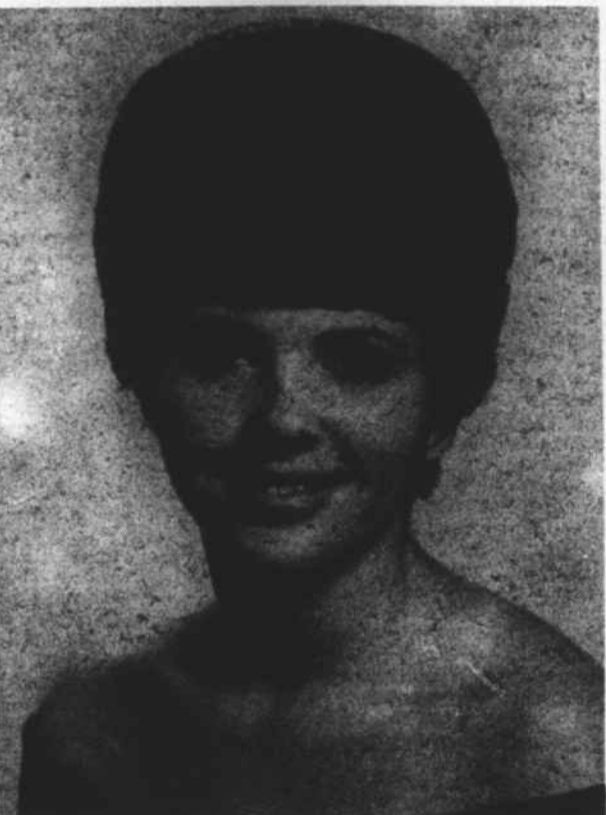
